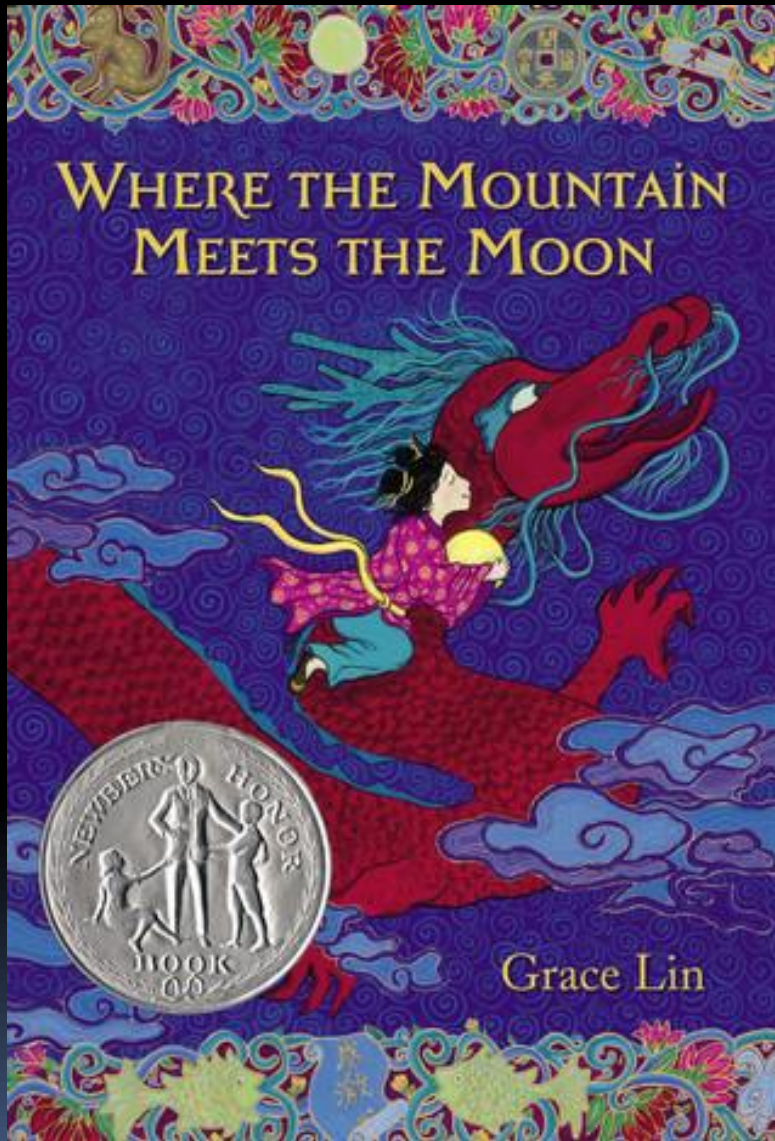
Historical fiction two viewpoints in each book. In this one Lizzie is a mill girl who supports worker's rights and fights for reform.

Josh, the mill owner's son lives in luxury unaware of his family's abusive labor practices.

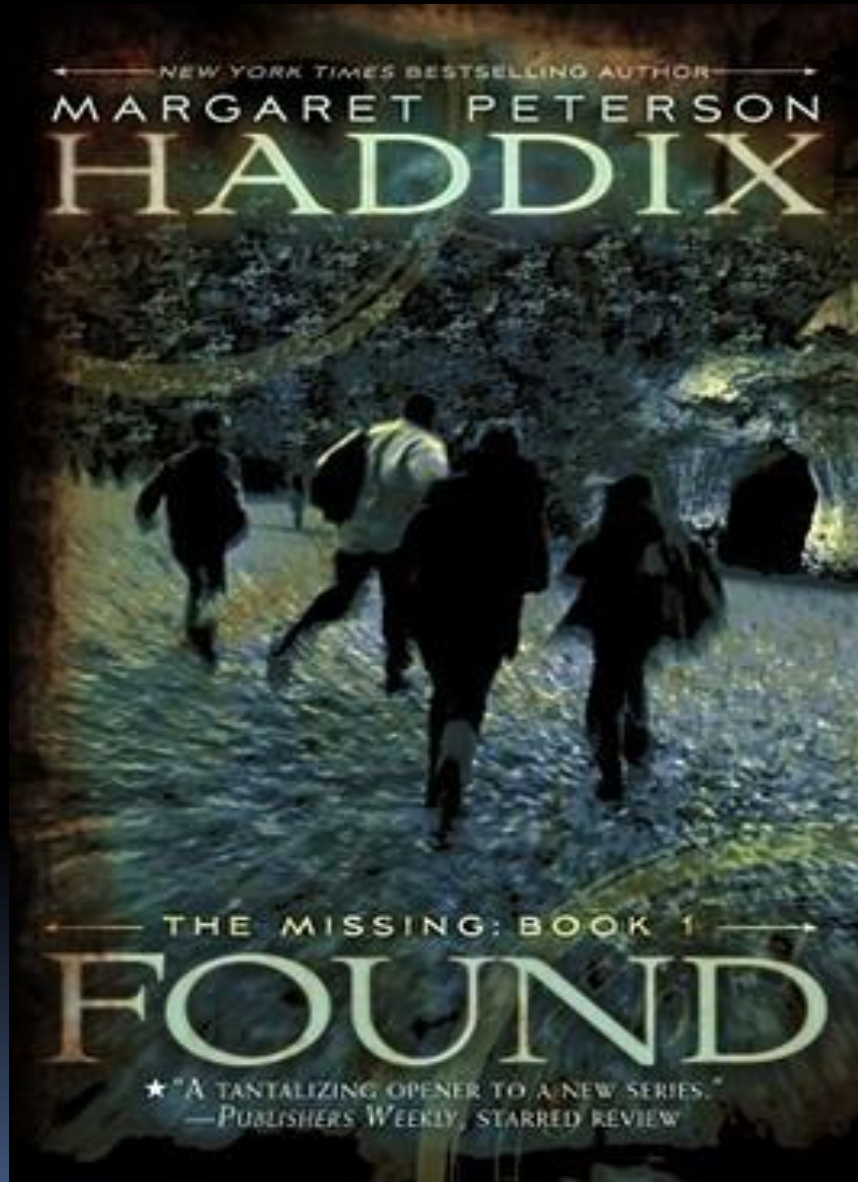
# Where the Mountain Meets the Moon

Reads like traditional Chinese folktales with stories within stories. Minli leaves on a quest to find the answer to change her poor family's fortune.



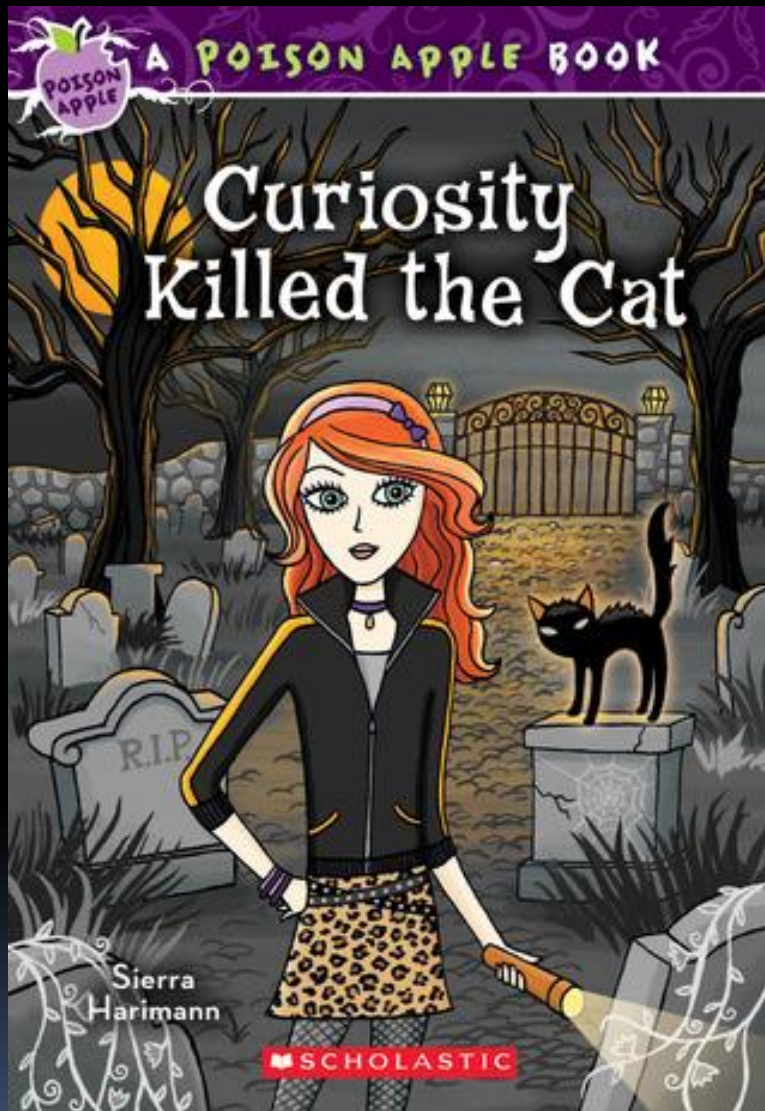

A middle school where students with supernatural powers learn to be villainous.

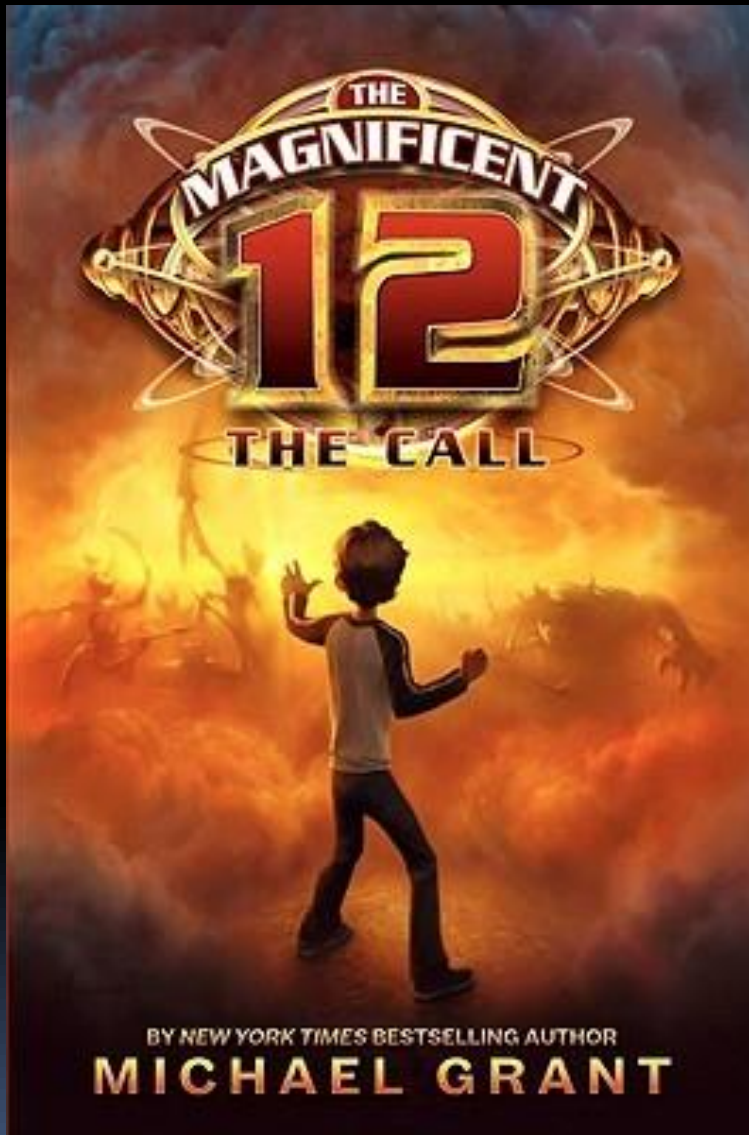


## A Mutiny in Time

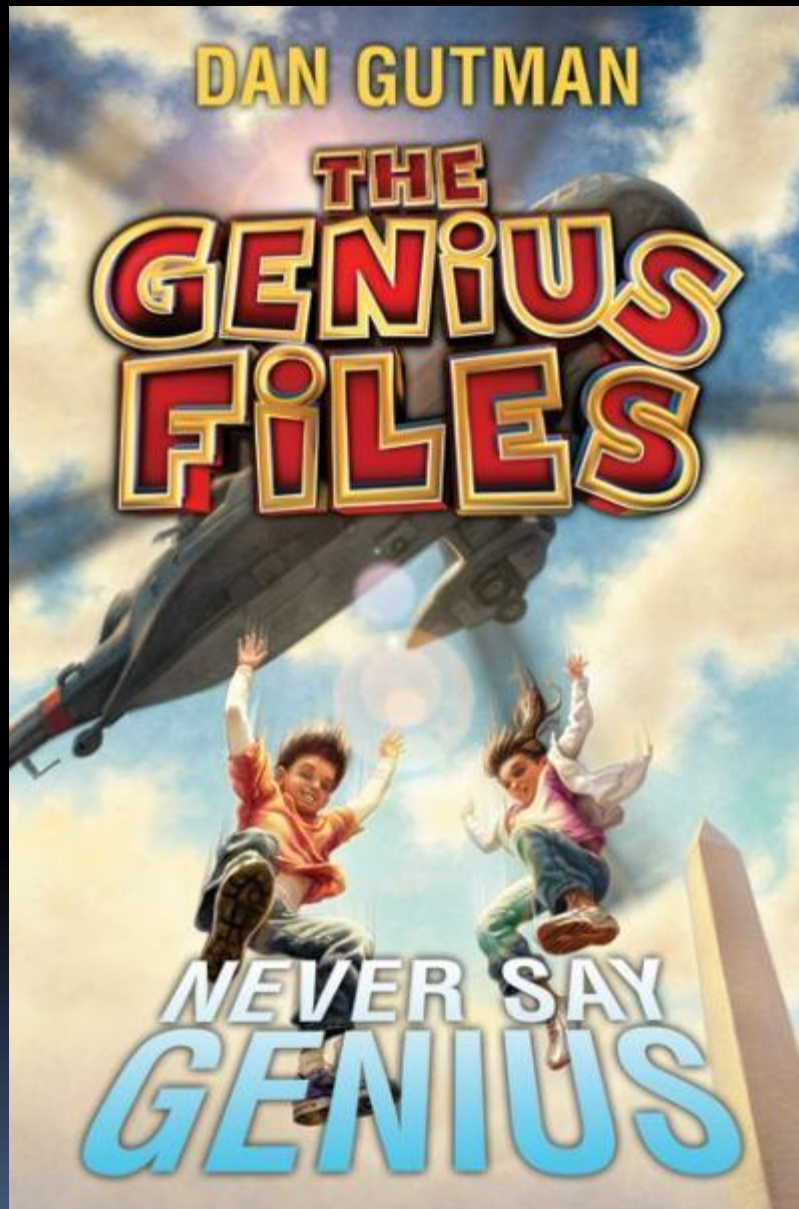
## The Call

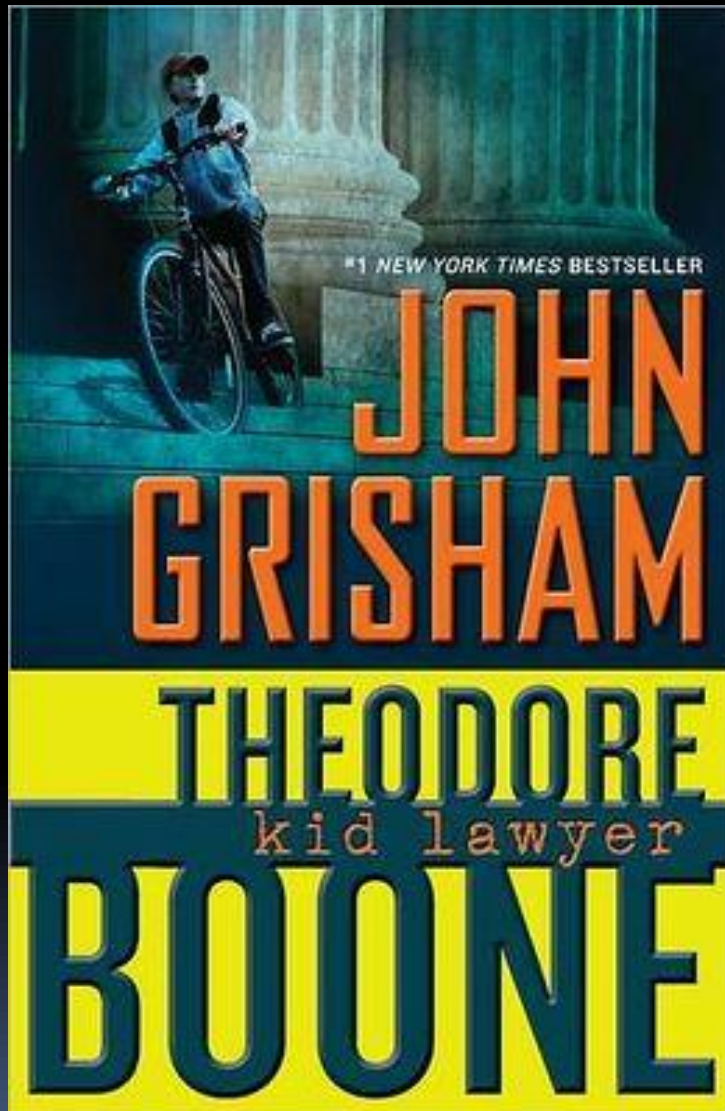




## Never Say Genius (The Genius Files, #2)

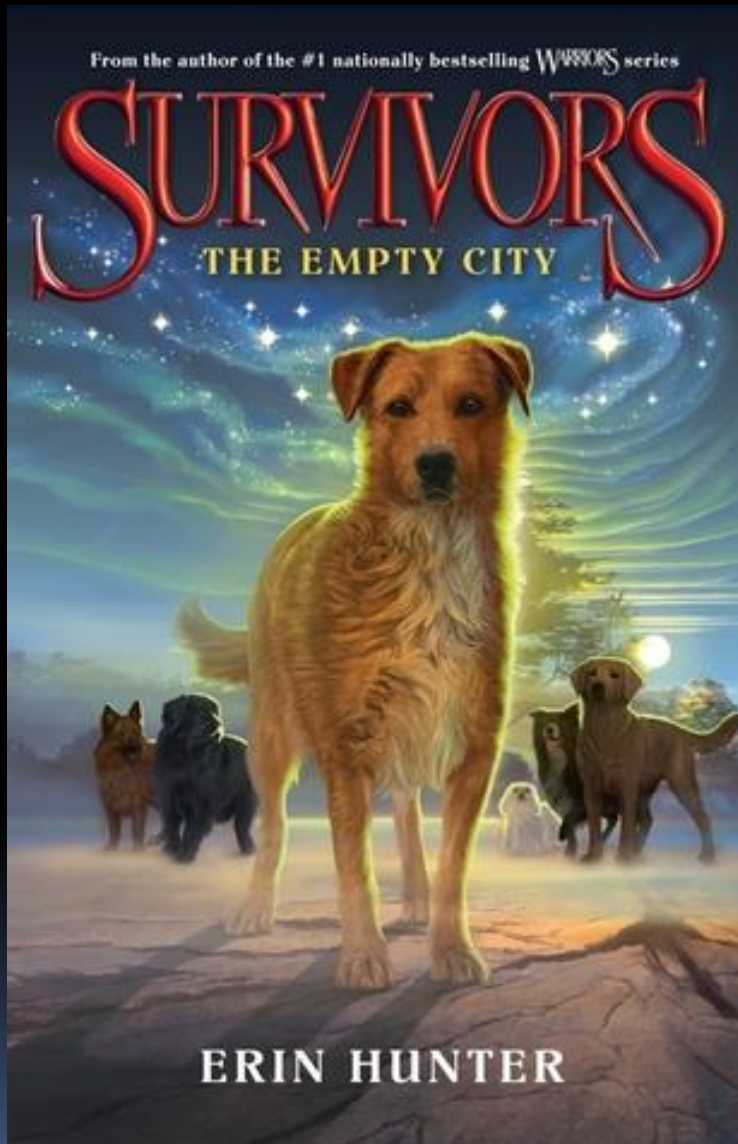
13 year old twins Coke and Pepsi, part of the Genius Files secret society, travel cross country with their parents, while avoiding assassins. Preposterous fun!

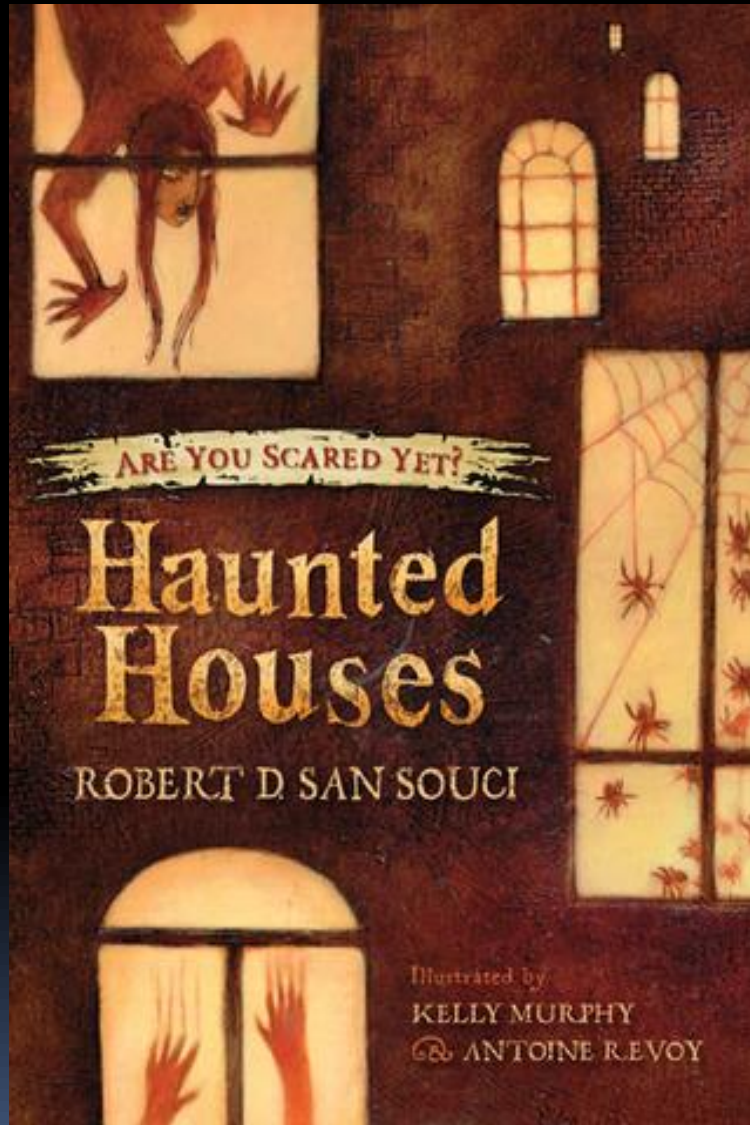


# Haunted Houses

Beka Cooper is a rookie law-enforcer in the rough part of town where a magical crime wave is profiting.

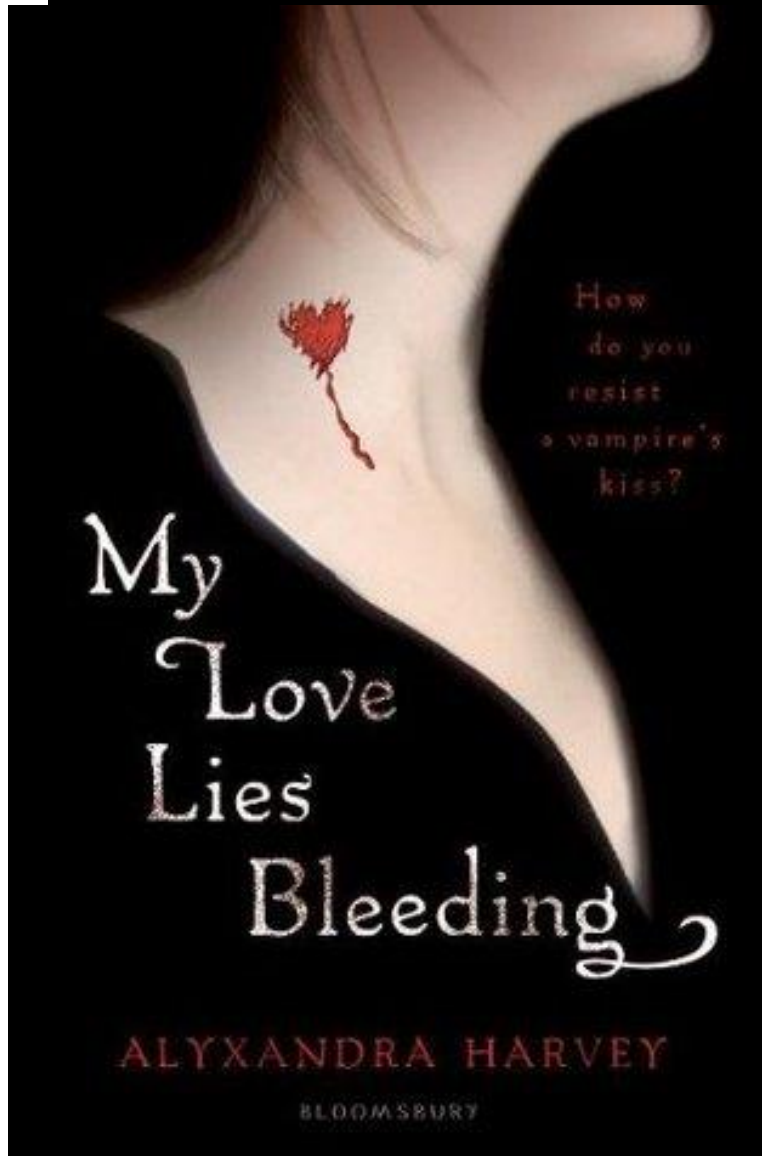

An EMP flashes killing many, or turning them into zombie-like creatures, except for a few special people now fighting to survive.

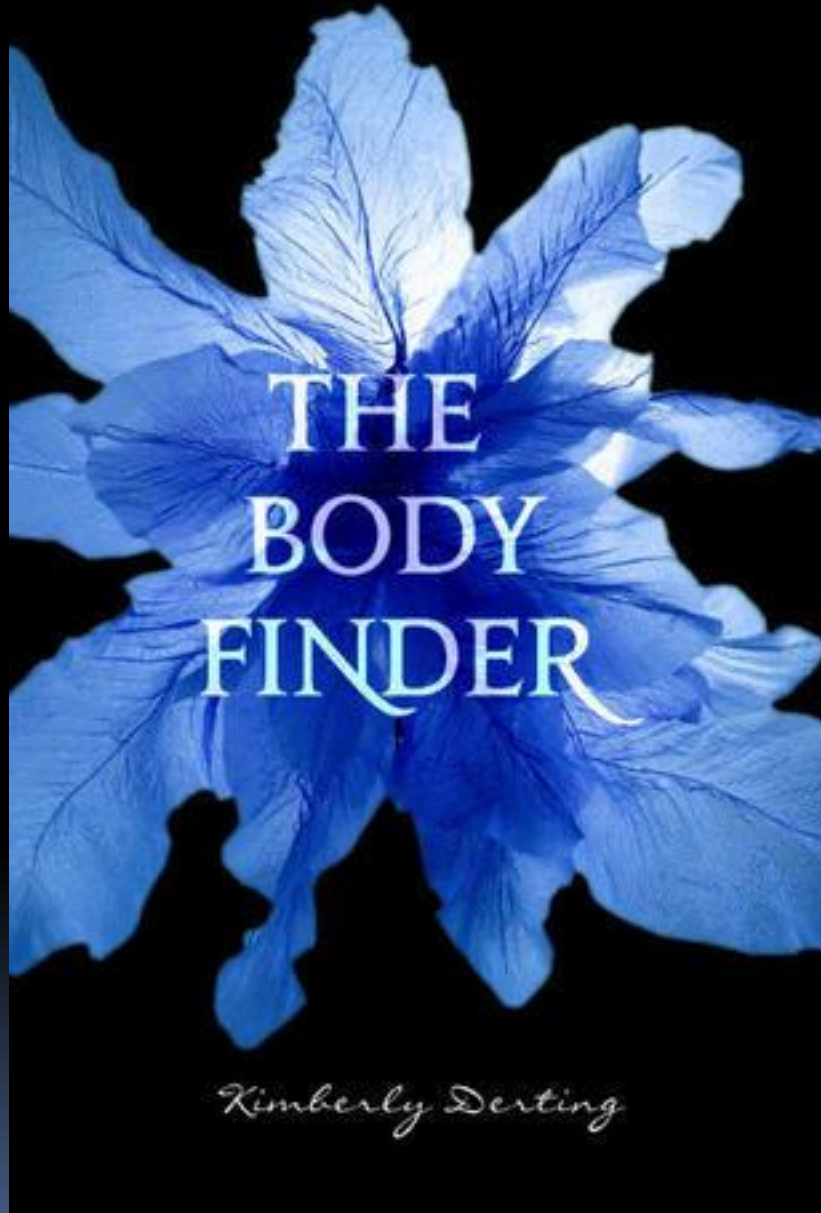
